

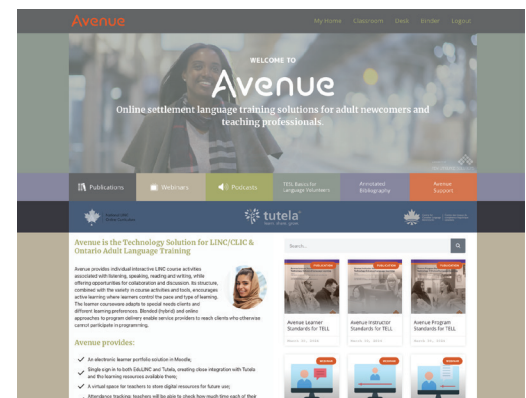

Avenue is a four-skill modern solution to online or blended language training. Logging into Avenue also means logging into Tutela, providing access to hundreds of Made-in-Canada learning resources for LINC, CLIC and Ontario Adult Language Training. The Avenue learning management system (LMS) runs on Moodle, and includes new activities and custom applications, such as the automated Course Builder.

Avenue offers more tools to administrators and teachers, including a user account manager giving teachers control over their course enrolments, student accounts and making it easier to move students between classes. Avenue supports modernized task-based learning through a Portfolio-based Language Assessment (PBLA)-aligned e-Portfolio solution. And Avenue's eUnit Catalogue of PBLA-aligned learning resources is growing as developers like New Language Solutions (NLS), the Centre for Canadian Language Benchmarks and Achev release new modules and eUnits.

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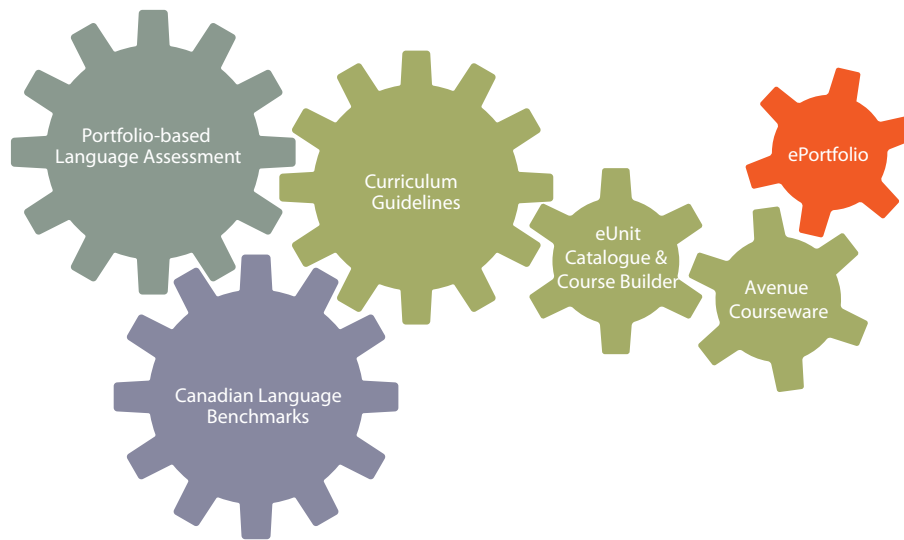
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This diagram illustrates the interlocking pieces that make Avenue effective and efficient.

An LMS provides a virtual private learning space that enables Technology-enhanced language learning (TELL). Moodle is our LMS platform of choice. It's open-source software and license free, and it's supported by a worldwide community of millions of educators. It has about 50% market share in Europe and Latin America, and 30% in North America.

Basic computer skills like using a web browser, e-mailing or word processing are all you need to master the tools and put made-in-Canada tell materials to work in your classroom.

What does an LMS solution represent for the settlement language training sector? It's an opportunity for deeper engagement with learning, and building social interaction into a virtual classroom. It enables more flexibility in program design and delivery. It supports anywhere anytime learning. The Avenue LMS has been customized to support PBLA. The NLS developers have added a custom competency framework to Avenue based on the CLB Can-Do Statements. These competency areas and statements are used in the artifacts and inventory reports.

User Account Manager

Avenue offers more tools to administrators and teachers, including a user account manager giving teachers control over their course enrolments, student accounts and making it easier to move students between classes. These functions can also be assigned to admin assistant staff at service providers on request.

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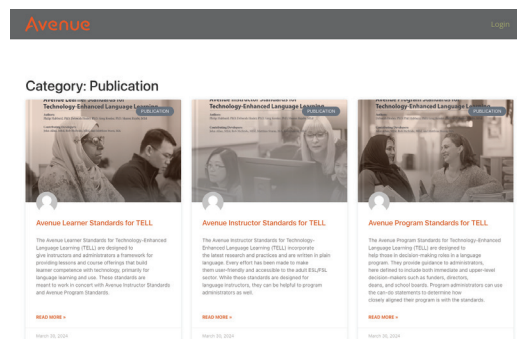
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Avenue Standards for TELL

An expert team completed work in 2024 on three booklets: Instructor, Learner and Program Standards for Technology-enhanced Language Learning (TELL). The three sets articulate better practices and performance indicators for all concerned in adult language training. The standards describe how to keep the human at the centre of learning and teaching while thoughtfully employing learning technology. What's New?

- Avenue's Course Builder is available to all instructors. This innovative tool enables teachers to create custom courses and update live courses with ready-made content.
- Avenue's eUnit Catalogue offers more than 435 CLB-aligned modules and eUnits from literacy to benchmark 8. These modules can be browsed, searched, previewed, tested and used to build custom courses.
- Improvements to the ePortfolio include bug fixes, redesigned toolbars and artifacts, and expanded auto collection of activities (surveying tools) and instructor feedback.
- The Learner Progress Summary panel is fully functioning. It provides an inventory of learner artifacts in all courses by CLB level, skill, competency area, and whether or not they were successful.

Coming Soon

- Instructors will be able to send a custom course welcome email to individuals or the whole class through the Class Register.
- Improvements to reporting for funders, especially in co-funded classes.
- Editing teachers will be able to use their unified login with Tutela.ca to seamlessly add resources from the Tutela collections to their Avenue courses.

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What's in the Pipeline?

- The ePortfolio Additional Info. activity settings will allow editing teachers to pre-set CLB/competency info and task type, eliminating the need to update individual artifacts with this info.
- New tools for online attendance tracking.
- Expanded artifact auto collection: Choice and Journal activities; instructor feedback.
- Improved Instructor Live help: Embedded in courseware, AI offline support.
