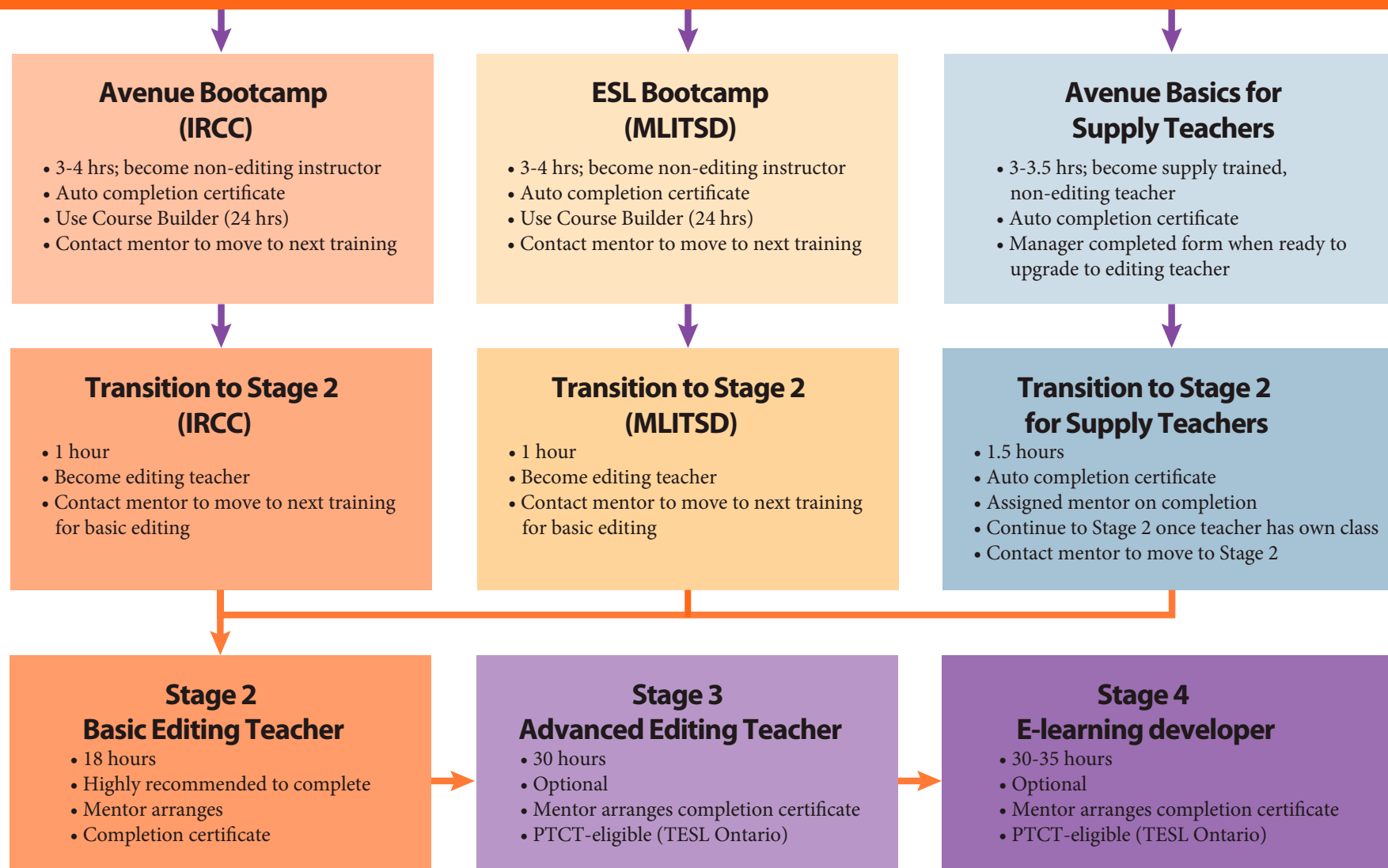

Other Avenue Training

Introduction to Avenue Learning Leadership

Time commitment: 25 hours over 8 weeks

Intake method: Facilitated cohorts 2x/year

Description: Managers or coordinators (or those aspiring to be leaders in their own contexts) will explore topics including the Avenue project, CALL and TELL, blended learning, the Avenue Standards, and AI from the perspectives of leadership, navigating change, and innovation theories. This is a PTCT-eligible course through TESL Ontario.

Advanced Avenue Learning Leadership

Time commitment: 25 hours over 8-10 weeks

Intake method: Facilitated cohorts 2x/year

Description: This course prepares professionals to build plans and strategies for the integration of blended learning in their organization, and apply the plan through management of an organization's human and technology resources. This course builds on the Avenue Learning Leadership course with targeted modules including: Avenue Learner, Instructor and Program Standards for TELL, managing artificial intelligence, managing Avenue, online teaching and learning, Classroom Management and Program Performance, and the Preparing to Lead (Capstone Project).

Avenue Digital Assistant Course (ADAC)

Time commitment: 3-4 hours

Intake method: continuous

Description: This training can be requested by SPO managers for non-teaching staff in their organization. In this course, digital assistants will learn how to navigate Avenue and how to support teaching and learning on the platform. The course teaches practical skills to troubleshoot common issues. Topics covered include system roles on Avenue, using the course builder, managing a course, managing blocks and learning activities, using the e-Portfolio, wrapping up and starting a new term.

TESL Basics for Language Volunteers - Train the Trainer (TBLV)

Time commitment: 2-3 hours

Intake method: continuous

Description: Instructors who have completed Stage 2 of the Avenue Teacher Training can choose to become a volunteer coach in their organization. The training can be requested by a SPO manager. Participants in TBLV Train the Trainer familiarize themselves with either TBLV (for language volunteers) or TBLV Works (for volunteers in employment training programs). They reflect on their role as a volunteer coach, and the support that volunteers in their organisation will need. After completing the training, participants can receive a copy of either the TBLV or TBLV Works course to use with local volunteers.
